



Star 4 Square From Silver Rectangle


Use four silver rectangles or ratio between 1.25:1 and 1.5:1
Finished model ratio 2.3


The first two steps are familiar from making a square from an oblong. However, instead of cutting off the leftover rectangle, two 45° folds make flaps for a secure lock. However, the units can slide a little: when made from A7 rectangles, the units can slide about 15 mm. Note that you can use rectangles other than silver rectangles, as long as they are not longer than 3:2. 8.5 by 11 inch paper cut into quarters would work.














- Bisect the lower left right angle: valley fold the bottom edge to the left vertical edge. Turn over.
- 2 Fold the lower flap up so that the fold aligns with the raw edge behind it. Make two 45° folds on the new flap.
- The mountain fold of the right flap that follows the folded edge behind. Unfold the right flap.










- Rotate the first unit 45° anticlockwise. and the second unit 45° clockwise. Hook the folded flap of the second unit between the layers of the first unit.
- 2 After hooking the second unit onto the first, slide the second unit to the right as far as it will go.
- 3 Slide the second unit to the right as far as it will go.






- Mountain fold the flap of the 5 Two units joined. first unit behind to finish joining the first two units.
- Hook the third unit onto the second unit. Slide it down as far as it will go.



- Mountain fold the flap to finish joining the third unit to the second.
- Hook the fourth unit onto the third unit. Slide and mountain fold to lock. Unfold the small triangular flap of the first unit.
- To join the fourth to the first, lift the end of the fourth unit up and over the first unit.



- Hold the end of the fourth unit and move it to the right.
- Valley fold the small flap of the first unit into the fourth unit.
- Mountain fold the small I flap of the fourth unit into the first unit to finish joining all units.
